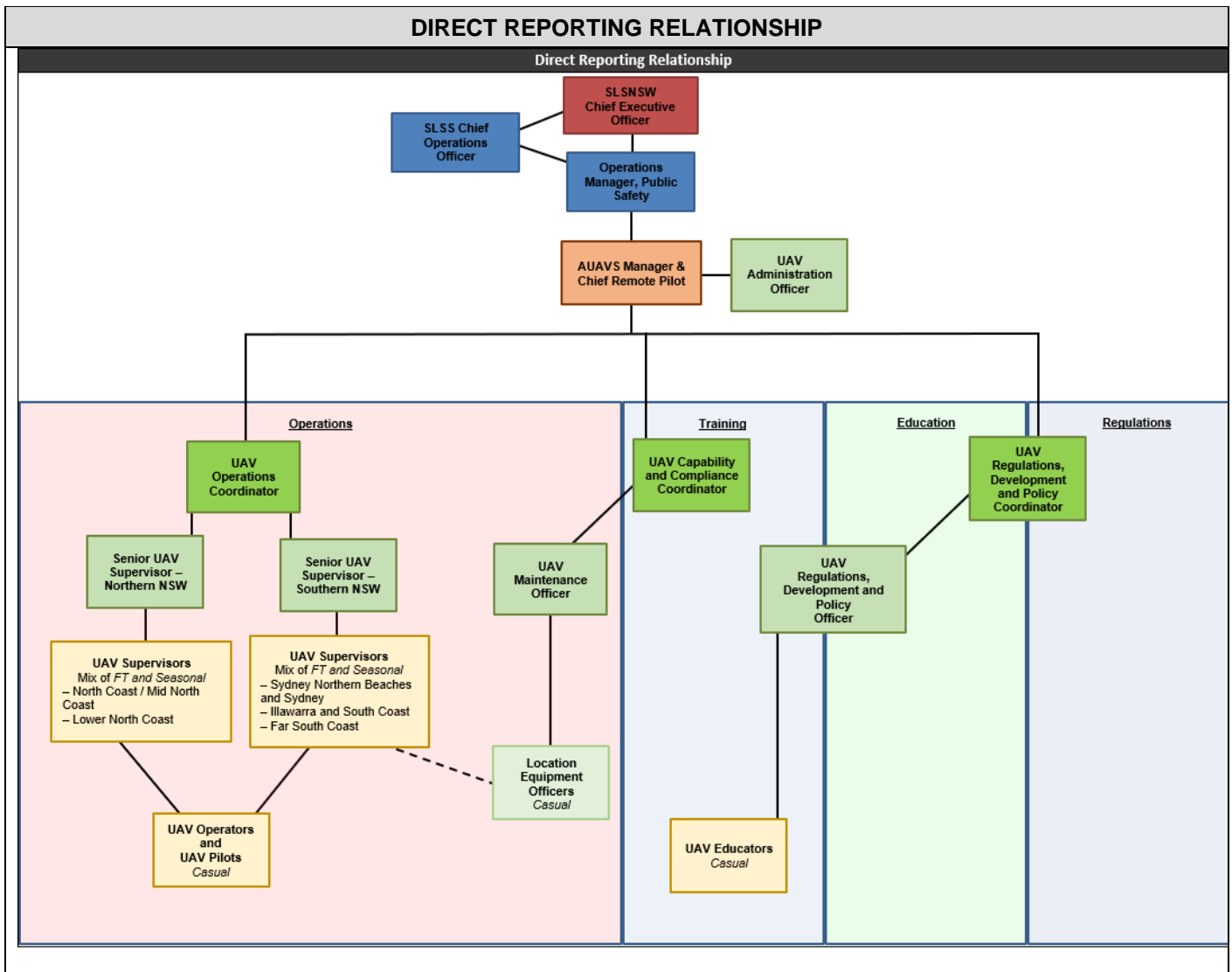

Training and Competency	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Carry out patrolling and safety functions in the most efficient, appropriate, and proactive manner in accordance with relevant regulations, guidelines and procedures endorsed and implemented by the Australian UAV Service; All equipment is placed in an appropriate location at commencement of duty. Equipment is checked daily for wear, tear and damage and any deficiency is reported to the UAV Location Equipment Officer immediately; Be proactive in promoting and educating the public on beach safety and UAV safety through informal discussions with beach-users or formal presentation to groups at the beach. During any such presentation UAV services are not to be compromised; All standards relevant to UAV operations are maintained at all times; Work in a manner that promotes teamwork and cooperation; Always maintain a well presented and professional image and the AUAVS uniform is worn in accordance with AUAVS policy; Carry out specific tasks as required by the UAV Operations Coordinator, UAV Supervisor, or Location Equipment Officer; Undergo and successfully complete the SLSNSW UAV Operator Induction Program (OIP) (if not already completed); Display a high level of practical competence in operations training, including maintaining situational awareness; Complete inductions into local operating areas as required by local councils and surf life saving clubs (SLSCs); Undergo training for specialised operational activities (e.g. EVLOS, BVLOS, SAREX); Undergo a yearly proficiency check by the Chief Remote Pilot (or delegated representative), as well as a proficiency check if the UAV Pilot has not flown at least 1 battery in the last 90 days;
Administration	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Maintain all appropriate documentation and reports; Data entry, particularly AVCRM Job Logs and Deputy; Following consultation with the AUAVS management team ensure operational issues are communicated with Land Managers and other regulatory bodies that the AUAVS provides services to; Participate in procedure reviews and development where required; Ensure courteous and professional communication with internal stakeholders such as Surf Life Saving Clubs and external agencies including Council Rangers, Police and Ambulance. <p>Carry out specific tasks as required by the UAV Administration Officer.</p>
Service Delivery & Operations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Safe operating of UAVs and conduct of flight in accordance with company procedures detailed in the SLS Operations Manual and SLS Operations Library, particularly; Maintaining Visual Line of Sight when operating VLOS and situational awareness when flying VLOS, EVLOS, BVLOS or NVLOS; Maintaining a maximum flight altitude of less than 120m above ground level; Not operating the UAV within 30m of people not directly involved in that UAV operation; Abiding by the rules of air as defined by CASA's legislation and supporting documents, such as the Aeronautical Information Publication (AIP);

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Using the AVCRM application to manage each job mission, including feasibility checks, accident/incident reporting, defect reporting, flight syncing and wildlife observations; • Applying appropriate UAV emergency procedures if necessary. • SLS policies and procedures are complied with at all times; • Own fitness for duty is ensured, as per the SLS Manual; • UAVs are operated with a high level of competency under all flight conditions; • All UAV operations conducted comply with company procedures and CASA regulations; • All operative instructions given by the AUAVS Manager are complied with. • Any issues are reported to the AUAVS Manager or UAV Operations Coordinator and through the AVCRM application.

WORKING RELATIONSHIPS

Internal: A UAV Pilot interacts closely with other UAV Pilots, UAV Operators, Locations Equipment Officers (LEOs) Lifesavers and ALS Lifeguards to further public safety interests of SLSS and SLSNSW operations along the NSW coastline, and to ensure safe and efficient assigned UAV operations. A UAV Pilot will need to interact with SLSC Officials (Club Captains and Presidents) for the purposes of accessing SLSC spaces to carry out rostered work, and these should be carried out in a courteous and respectful manner. Any concerns and issues should be reported to the UAV Supervisor and/or UAV Operations Officer as directed.

External: Interactions with members of the public are likely to occur and a UAV Pilot should be open and positive when performing operational activities. Engagement with external Lifeguard agencies should be professional and helpful, providing them with information needed for their management of their scope of work.
